It is organised and run by the Newbury And District Amateur Radio Society (NADARS) and attracts visitors from all over the country. This highly popular event provides the ideal venue for anyone interested in radio, electronics or computing. Themed around a 'boot sale' it offers the opportunity to buy and sell everything from the smallest components used for making equipment or projects, through to complete communication systems. Whether you want the very latest full featured transceiver from the world's biggest manufacturers, or simply something second-hand at incredibly attractive prices, there are more than 100 stalls waiting to help you.

Directions:

From the A34 South bound:

Leave A34 at M4. Go around the roundabout to head north again, following signs for the 'showground'. Before you re-join the A34 northbound take the slip road to Chieveley. At the 'T' Junction at the end of the slip road turn right. The entrance will be found on the right

From the A34 North bound:

Turn off the A34 at M4. At the roundabout head north again, following signs for the 'showground'. Before you re-join the A34 northbound take the slip road to Chieveley. At the 'T' Junction at the end of the slip road turn right. The entrance will be found on the right

From the M4 East or West bound:

Leave the M4 at Junction 13 and head north, following signs for the 'showground'. Before you re-join the A34 northbound take the slip road to Chieveley. At the 'T' Junction at the end of the slip road turn right. The entrance will be found on the right



About N.A.D.A.R.S.

The Newbury and District Amateur Radio Society (NADARS) has been in existence for 100 years and has about 80 members. The call sign of the Society is G5XV.

We hold meetings on the fourth Wednesday of the month, starting at 19:30hrs, in the Acland Hall, Hermitage Rd, Cold Ash, RG18 9JF. At these meetings there is usually a talk relating to radio, electronics or computing. We also hold many other social and radio related events, such as contests and special event stations etc. In addition, we run training courses to enable members of the public become radio amateurs. The first is a two-day "Foundation Licence" course which trains you in the basics of amateur radio and how to operate an amateur radio station safely. At the end of the course participants take a basic examination to obtain their transmitting licence. We have a 99.8% success rate with this course & exam!

There are many facets to amateur radio; a popular one at NADARS is contesting, and the club has an excellent track record of results.

Events vary, but the basic principle is to make as many radio contacts as possible in a specified period of time. A very popular series of contests runs regularly each month where members operate from home and individual scores are added to make a club total.

Other contests involve setting up a portable station 'in the field' for a weekend with temporary masts and aerials, operating from tents or caravans.
